MC York Live!

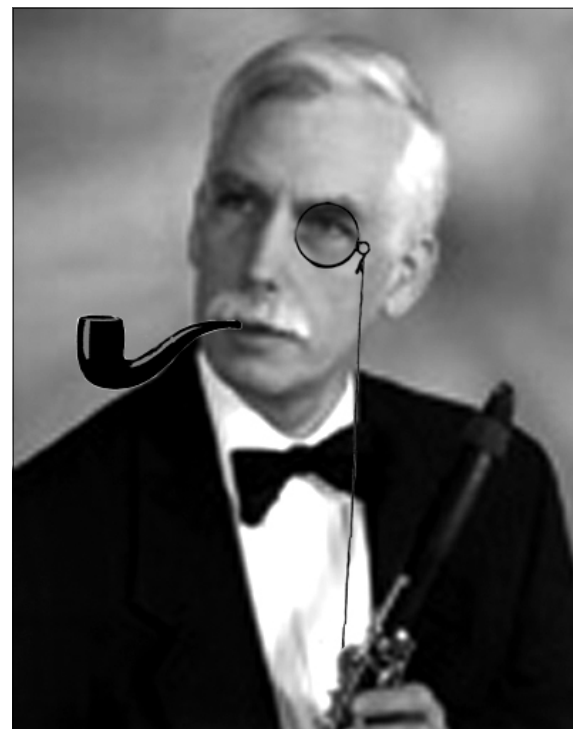
ZACH REICHART & CAREY DIXON
